## Administration Remarks

As we continue with our “*Tradition of Excellence*,” we have implemented Restorative Practices and Circles with all of our students. Restorative Questions bookmarks have been distributed to students as a reminder of the process and for them to use at home.

Administration and staff members are using the questions in response to situations that arise in the classroom, hallways, cafeteria, or on the playground during recess. Rather than simply punishing students for wrongdoing, using Restorative Practices holds them accountable by involving them in a face-to-face meeting with the people they had the conflict.

Some of the students have begun to use the questions with their peers as a way to help them problem-solve. To be “restorative” means to believe that decisions are best made and conflicts are best resolved by those most directly involved in them. The restorative practices movement seeks to develop good relationships and restore a sense of community in an increasingly disconnected world. Restorative Practices is not merely a discipline approach.

By actively engaging students in this process, adults are doing things with students, rather than to them or for them. The adults show respect toward students, both by holding them to a higher standard of behavior and by giving them the support they need to become more responsible.

Thank you for your continued support in making a great effort to send your child to school and to be on time. It is important for parents to reinforce the significance of good attendance and being on time to

school. Just a reminder that doors open at 7:30am when free breakfast is served, the tardy bell rings at 8:00am, and students are dismissed from school at 3:00pm.

Showing up on time to school each day and/or not leaving school early benefit students’ academic performance and future professional habits. Students who arrive to school early have an advantage over classmates who enter through the door after class has begun.

Children want time to visit with their friends and to settle into the classroom routine. Being late does not make the transition easy for them and they may feel anxious or rushed. Children are also easily distracted. A classmate who enters the classroom after an activity has begun or leaves early in the middle of the activity causes disruption which takes time away from valuable activities and good instruction. Some children are embarrassed when everyone’s attention is drawn to them. Being on time and not leaving early means that they are not an unexpected center of attention.

## Nurse's Notes

As the colder weather is settling in, please use these preventative measures to help stop the spreading of germs and head lice.

### Germs:

- Avoid close contact with others.
- Cough and sneeze into your elbow.

## SAFE SPORTS SCHOOL AWARD

**Lockland High School Receives National Athletic Trainers' Association Safe Sports School Award**  
*(Program recognizes high schools that help to keep young athletes safe.)*

Lockland High School is the recipient of the National Athletic Trainers' Association Safe Sports School award. The award champions safety and recognizes secondary schools that provide safe environments for student athletes. The award reinforces the importance of providing the best level of care, injury prevention and treatment. This award recognizes the contributions and commitment of schools across the country that are implementing safe sports policies and best practices to ensure athletes can do what they love best and have the appropriate care in place to prevent, manage and treat injuries should they occur.

In order to achieve Safe Sport School status, Lockland ensured our athletic programs must do the following:

- Create a positive athletic health care administrative system
- Provide or coordinate pre-participation physical examinations
- Promote safe and appropriate practice and competition facilities
- Plan for selection, fit function and proper maintenance of athletic equipment
- Provide a permanent, appropriately equipped area to evaluate and treat injured athletes
- Develop injury and illness prevention strategies, including protocols for environmental conditions
- Provide or facilitate injury intervention
- Create and rehearse a venue-specific Emergency Action Plan
- Provide or facilitate psychosocial consultation and nutritional counseling/education
- Be sure athletes and parents are educated of the potential benefits and risks in sports as well as their responsibilities

## Classroom SPOTLIGHT

### Lockland Kindergarteners Have Been Working Hard!

They have been learning to recognize and produce rhyming words, identify beginning sounds, blend sounds into words, segment phonemes in spoken words, recognize and name all the letters of the alphabet and produce letter sounds. Additionally, they have been writing words and sentences using their phonemic awareness skills. In math, they are counting groups of items up to 10, writing numbers up to 10, and decomposing 10 into 2 different groups. Later this month, they will be learning about the first Thanksgiving with the Native Americans and the Pilgrims.
